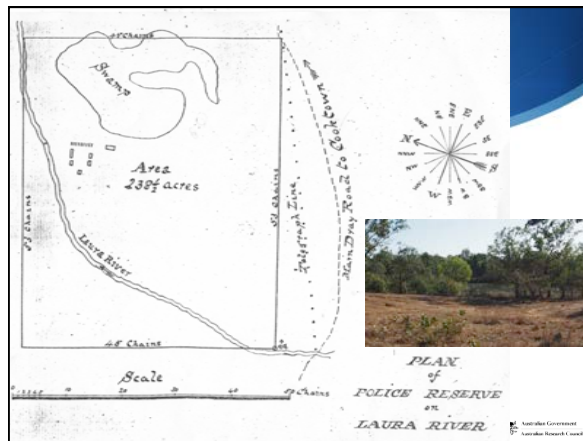

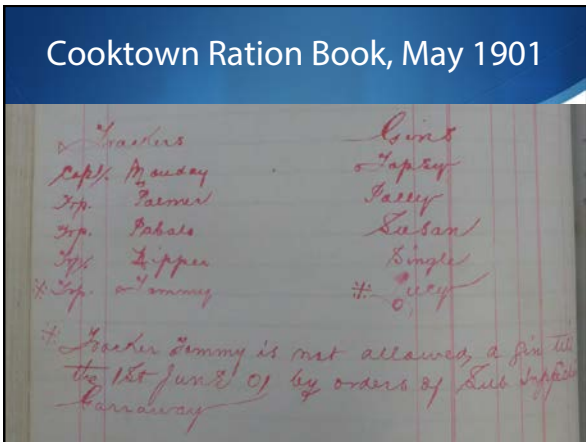
Inspector Charles Marrett, his wife Eugenie, and an unspecified officer at their house at Boralga, circa 1884 (PM0634)
